All shows start at 7:30 p.m. Dixie Swim Club by Jessie Jones, Nicholas Hope, Jamie Wooten Presented with special permission from **Dramatists Play Service** Five southern women, whose friendships began many years ago on their college swim team, set aside a long weekend every August to recharge those relationships. Free from husbands, kids and jobs, they meet at the same beach cottage on North Carolina's Outer Banks to catch up, laugh, and meddle in each other's lives. The play focuses on four of those weekends and spans 22 years in the lives of Sheree, Dinah, Lexie, Vernadette and Jeri Neal. As their lives unfold and the years pass, these women increasingly rely on one another, through advice and raucous repartee, to get through the challenges life flings at them. With his wife off in the country, suave Richard Willey, a junior minister in the British government, takes advantage of an
